






THEATRE FESTIVAL

On July 24, 2024, Hindustan International School, Guindy, conducted a fire safety drill for Grades 6 to 11, led by Dr. Rajaji. The session included theoretical learning on fire prevention, hazard identification, and evacuation procedures, followed by practical demonstrations using fire extinguishers. EFFECTIVE WRITING

On July 22, 2024, Mr. Johnson Mathews, Dean of Academics, conducted an Effective Writing Skills session for Grade 11 and 12 students at Hindustan International School. Held in the Grade 12 classroom, the session emphasized the impact of effective writing on assessments and assignments, the importance of note-taking, and critical questions to consider before writing.

Mr. Mathews discussed why writing may be ineffective and how to improve it through feedback. He highlighted the importance of both internal (self-reflection) and external (teacher and examiner) feedback. Students were advised to ensure relevant content and proper sentence structure in their writing.







TO ENFORCE DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS

On July 26, 2024, from 3:40 PM to 4:20 PM, a face-to-face meeting was held in class 7B to discuss enhancing student discipline. Led by the Dean of Academics, attendees included the Principal, HRES, and subject teachers for grades 6 to 12. The meeting emphasized the importance of consistent enforcement and clear expectations. Key points included not allowing bad behavior to continue, reinforcing good behavior, establishing class rules, managing defiant students, and maintaining a healthy lifestyle. The focus was on creating a positive learning environment where discipline supports effective education and student success.









BASIC LIFE SUPPORT AWARENESS

On July 27, 2024, Hindustan International School, Guindy, organized a Basic Life Support (BLS) awareness camp for its staff. Conducted by Mr. Nithyanandan E from the Global Gleneagles Team, the camp aimed to equip teachers with vital life-saving skills. The session covered comprehensive first aid techniques, BLS, and CPR training, and included hands-on practice. Staff members learned to manage injuries, perform CPR, and use AEDs effectively.
