LIFE SKILL – DINNING ETIQUETTES

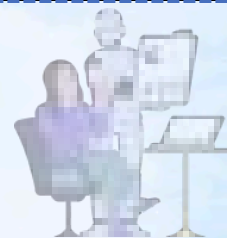

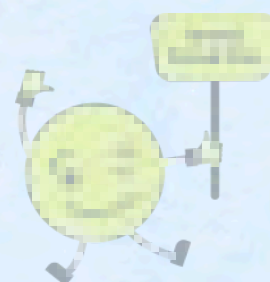


EMOJI DAY
