TEACHER TRAINING SESSION: WHY CHILDREN LOSE INTEREST IN STUDIES

A teacher training session on "Why Children Lose Interest in Studies" was conducted on 25th May 2026 at the St. Thomas Block Auditorium for 45 educators from HiStar, Primary, Lower Secondary, and Upper Secondary sections. The session was facilitated by Ms. Anindhitha Ramesh.

The resource person highlighted the various factors that contribute to student disengagement, including academic pressure, lack of motivation, fear of failure, emotional stress, and distractions. Educators gained valuable insights into the importance of building positive teacher-student relationships, creating supportive learning environments, and adopting student-centred teaching practices.

The session also focused on practical strategies to enhance student engagement through interactive learning, positive reinforcement, effective communication, and classroom management techniques. Through active discussions and experience-sharing, educators reflected on ways to make learning more meaningful and motivating for students.

REFLECTIVE TEACHING PRACTICES
