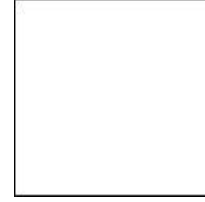

RULES AND REGULATIONS

School Diary

School Diary details are uploaded in ERP. Parents to check the ERP for regular updates.

Attendance and Leave of Absence

1. Application for leave should be made on the pages provided in the School Calendar. A handwritten note/e-mail can also be sent.
2. For every absence, a written statement signed by the Parent/Guardian is required on the day the Student returns. If the Student is absent for more than 7 days continuously for reasons of ill-health, a certificate thereof from a Doctor is required stating illness and fitness.
3. Students will not be allowed to leave the School early unless the Parent/Guardian presents a written request to the Office.
4. A Student requiring leave for any part of the day on account of sudden illness or such unavoidable circumstances should obtain prior permission of the Principal before leaving the School. The Absence Record duly signed by the Parent/Guardian should be submitted the next working day to the Class Teacher.
5. Attendance on the first day of School after vacation is mandatory.
6. Any unscheduled holidays will be made good by the School according to the days available.

General Discipline

1. Students are requested to behave politely and avoid use of offensive language or actions injurious to the feelings of fellow Students, Teachers, or others in this School. Any such behaviour indicative of hurting others, insult to caste or community will attract serious disciplinary action.
2. Violation of the rules and regulations and the discipline of the School is punishable including removal or expulsion from School. Such actions will normally follow a written warning to allow improvement in conduct.
3. Students who are selected to participate in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities even outside School will not be permitted to abstain from such activities without prior permission of the Class Teacher/ Principal.
4. Staying away from School functions without prior permission and/or justification will be considered as a breach of School discipline.
5. No Student is allowed to use the smart boards/laptops/overhead projector without the written permission of the Teacher.

School Property

1. Every Student should take care of the School property. Intended or neglectful damage to School property is a serious breach of School discipline.
2. Students should cooperate with the Library, ICT and Laboratory Staff in maintaining order and discipline. Students shall take care not to lose, damage or deface any of the materials, fixtures, or equipment that is provided.
3. Damages made even by accident should be reported at once to the Home Room Educator/Principal. Any damage caused will be made good by the one who has done it.

Personal Belongings

1. Students should not bring valuables or money to School. They are not allowed to bring to School: magazines, mobile phones, video games, cameras, pictures or books, CD/thumb drives/cassettes other than prescribed, except when asked by the Teacher.
2. Students found possessing, reading, viewing any material of indecent nature are liable to rustication without notice.
3. Every Student should take care of his/her personal belongings. The School authorities do not shoulder responsibility for loss of such belongings.
4. Name of the Student and Grade should be marked clearly in bold letters on the personal belongings to facilitate recovery when lost in the School premises.
5. Students are expected not to wear any expensive items such as jewelry or watches. The School will not be liable for loss of any personal expensive items.

Cleanliness

1. Students must come to School in neat and well maintained School Uniforms with their nails trimmed and hair properly cut. No hair coloring and styling will be allowed.
2. It is the duty of all the Students to keep their classrooms and other places in and around the School clean and in order. They should dispose of garbage only in the dustbins provided.
3. Before leaving the classroom Students will pick up waste paper, any unwanted material from the floor and place it in the dustbin. They will leave desks and chairs in proper order and will switch off all lights, fans, and air conditioners.
4. No jewelry of any kind is allowed in School. Earrings worn should be small and not made of gold.

Library

1. Strict silence should be observed in the Library at all times.
2. Students must acquire the habit of reading as it is important for their education process. Parents are required to motivate their children to cultivate this habit.
3. Books will be issued to all Students.
4. Any book that is lost must be replaced or duly compensated for. A fine will be levied for damage to the books borrowed.
5. No book, magazine, or newspaper should be taken out without the permission of the Librarian.

Objectionable Materials

1. Students are strictly forbidden to bring any offensive literature.
2. Children are forbidden to bring crackers, explosives and other dangerous materials to School.
3. No Student should bring any electronic gadgets as they are not permitted on the School Campus.

Malpractices

1. Any Student found copying or indulging in any type of malpractice during the Tests/Assessments will not be allowed to take subsequent assessments until the Principal grants him/her written permission besides giving zero in the subject concerned along with a warning letter.
2. Such a Student must bring his/her Parents to meet the Principal. Repetition of the same will result in dismissal/expulsion from School.
3. A Student who tampers with the Marks, Answer Sheets or School Certificates will be suspended.

Participation in Sports and Games

1. Every Student must take part in School Games and other activities unless declared physically unfit or exempted by the Principal on any grounds like medical treatment, illness, chronic ailment etc.
2. Attendance in all official School functions like Exhibition, Sports Day, Independence Day, Annual Day etc. is mandatory.
3. Absentees may be fined or penalized.

Concerning Defaulters, Accidents & Excursions

1. The School accepts no responsibility if the Student is made to return home during class hours for not wearing the correct and proper School uniform, for not bringing the books to class, for not producing the signature of Parents on remarks written by Teachers or on Absence Record in the Calendar for reasons of indiscipline and for repeated late comings.
2. The School cannot be held responsible for accidents, small or serious to Students during School hours or excursions.
3. Students are not allowed to meet Parents or to leave the School premises during School hours without the permission of the Principal.

Morning Assembly

1. Students must be punctual for class every working day. They must be present in the School by 8.25 am. Proper decorum has to be maintained during and after the Assembly.
2. All Students must be in their classrooms seated before the Teacher enters the classroom. During the absence of the Teacher or period change over, proper discipline has to be maintained. The Class Monitor should see to the discipline and his/her command to be obeyed by all.

Medical Emergencies

In case of any medical emergency arising during School hours for any child, the School will provide the needed first aid within the Campus with the in-house Nurse and will inform the Parents about the same. Further steps will be taken only after taking the necessary consent from the Parents. However, the School also has tie-up with CHETTINAD hospital during any emergency situation. If your child is provided any regular medicine during School hours, we request you to kindly inform the School Nurse and the Class Teacher about the same and also submit a letter and the prescription from the Doctor.

Prior Permission

1. No money or articles of presentation shall be collected by anybody without the permission of the Principal.
2. Any organized activity in the School can be conducted only after getting the prior permission of the Management through the Principal.

Transport System

The School operates buses to “pick up” and “drop” children at specific points only covering a radius of 15 Kms from the School. Moderate charges have been worked out location/ distance wise and the charges for using the transport are to be paid along with the Tuition Fee.

Please note that

- There will be no door to door pickup or drop service.
- The School bus will not ply on kachha/narrow roads.
- Students should reach the pickup point five minutes before the actual time allotted. Similarly, Parents/Guardians who come to receive the children when they are back home should be at the pickup point ahead of time, else the child will be brought back to School and has to be collected from there.
- The School Bus will not wait at the bus stop for any late comers. The vehicle shall leave the bus stop immediately after the boarding of the Students present at the concerned point is complete. At no cost the bus will wait at any stop for anyone.

Discipline Guidelines- While travelling in the School vehicle.

1. No part of the Student’s body (arms, head, etc) should be held out of an open window at any given time.
2. Objects should never be thrown in the bus or outside the window.
3. Students must never move around while the bus is in motion. They are strictly prohibited to stand and travel.
4. Students are not permitted to reserve seats for themselves or for their friends.
5. Eating food items is not allowed in the bus.
6. The upholstery of the bus should not be damaged or marked in any way.
7. Shouting / quarrelling / fighting are not permitted on the bus.
8. Students on the bus should obey to the ‘Instruction and Guidance of the bus driver’ or ‘escorting staff’.

Parent - Teacher Conferences

1. The cooperation and goodwill of the Parents is an essential component of an effective Parent-Teacher relationship in order to provide maximum educational opportunities for children. The School needs the involvement of Parents in many of its activities.
2. Parents are encouraged to bring positive suggestions for the improvement of academic standards.
3. Parents shall not attempt to meet the Teachers when a class is in progress.
4. Criticism of the Teachers of the School in the presence of the Students must be avoided. Legitimate complaints should be brought to the notice of the Principal without delay.
5. Parents have the responsibility to encourage modest, decent, and good dressing habits conforming to acceptable social etiquettes in children from early stages of their development.
6. Attending the PTC (Parent-Teacher Conference) as well as other important functions in the School is a duty which Parents owe to their children.
7. Parents shall check the School Diary every day to take note of communication from the School contained therein and also for homework given, or can also view them on the School's web service.
8. Any requests, complaints etc. should be given in writing at the School Office or online addressed with a copy to the Principal.
9. Parents are requested to kindly verify with the Teachers about the timings of special classes.
10. Parents who are willing to volunteer for any School activities are requested to register their names with their areas of interest and available time frame with the Principal.
11. Mobile Phones / Handsets are prohibited for Students' use in School. Use of mobile phones can cause distraction, misuse and other behavioral disturbances among Students during their time in School.

Further, the Government of Tamil Nadu has banned the usage of mobile phones by Students in the School premises, the place of learning. HIS Karapakkam enforces a strict ban on the possession, use and misuse of mobile phones, SIM cards and even accessories related to mobile phones. Students going against this policy of School and that of the Government of Tamil Nadu will be viewed seriously. In such cases the School Authorities will automatically expel the concerned Student(s) with due intimation to their Parents.

School Uniform

Students are provided with uniforms that look elegant with stylish patterns in attractive colors. The fabrics are chosen keeping in view the climatic conditions and comfort. The garments need regular maintenance. The School insists that each child should possess at least 03 sets of School Uniform and 02 set of Sports Uniform. However extra sets of uniform will also be available at the School Office for Parents who wish to procure additional sets. Children are expected to wear neat and tidy uniforms on all working days.

Progress Report

2. The marks obtained in all Tests will be considered for promotion. Promotion is granted on the basis of whole year's performance acquiring minimum of 33% for Students of Grade 9, 10 & 11 and 40% for Students of Grade 3 to 8 in all subjects. If a Student is absent for any Test or Examination, he/she shall be marked absent and given zero. No re test will be conducted for anyone under any circumstances. In case of any emergency special permission has to be obtained from the Principal well in advance.
3. The School reserves the right to dismiss those whose progress in studies is steadily unsatisfactory or whose Parent/Guardian show little interest in the progress of their ward(s)
4. Promotion once decided, is final and cannot be reconsidered. (Hence Parents are requested not to disturb the Principal/Management for any reconsideration)
5. No Promoted Transfer Certificate will be given to a failed Student.

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE REGULATIONS :

1. **Application for Transfer Certificates** should be submitted to the Principal by **31 January of School year** failing which, the First Installment Fees for the new session should be remitted.
2. If the Student is withdrawn in the middle of the year, the fee has to be paid for the full year inclusive of the transport fee and **Student is not eligible for refund of caution deposit too.**
3. Transfer Certificate should be requested in prescribed proforma available in School office and Web portal with the required documents. No transfer certificate will be issued during vacations.
4. Transfer Certificate will be given only to those who have settled all the School dues and the No dues form acknowledged by the concerned authorities.
5. Caution Deposit will be refund will initiate once the TC formalities are completed and only for those applied TC within the month of January and Otherwise not eligible for refund of Caution deposit.
6. Transfer Certificate once issued cannot be cancelled. **Re-admission will be as per the admission procedure and considered only as new admission.**

FEE DETAILS :

1. All the payments are required to be paid either by Demand Draft or by Bank Transfer or by Credit / Debit Card at the School Counters.
2. Fee if paid online, Parents should mail the online Fee remittance receipt to the Class Teacher/School accountant for the confirmation of the payment along with the details of the student
