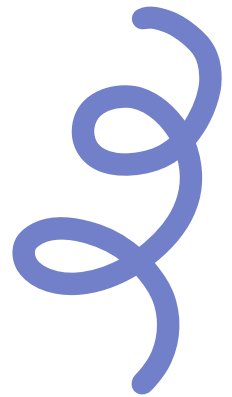

## KAMARAJAR DAY

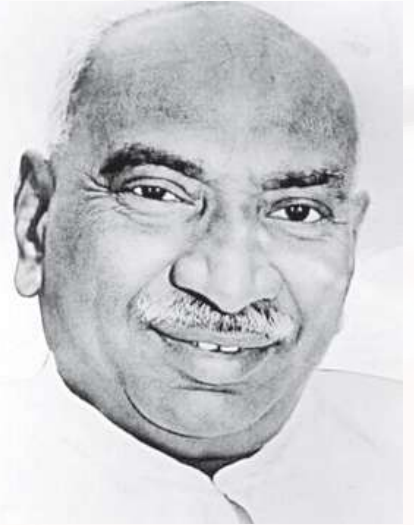

## LAUNCH OF ABE ENDORSED KIDS MBA

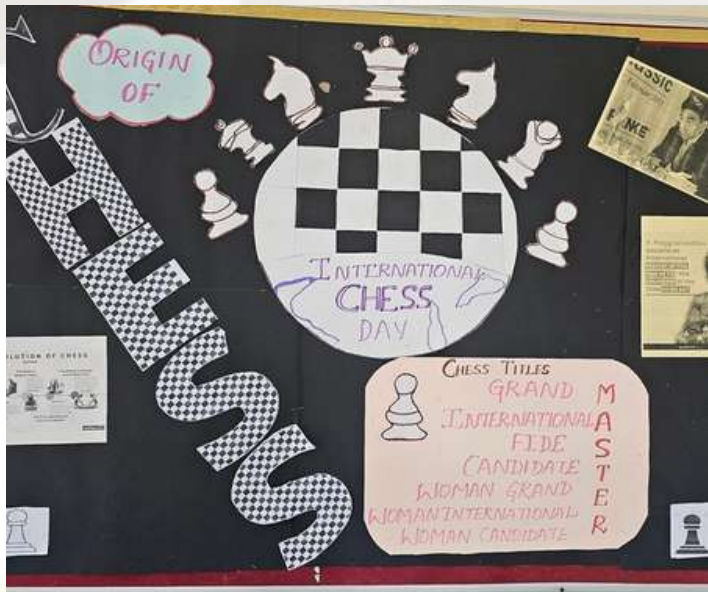
