HISTAR EVENTS

The sessions focused on enhancing classroom readiness, introducing new instructional approaches, and deepening understanding of two key curricula—HISTAR and the Cambridge Early Years framework.

HISTAR Curriculum Training

Ms. Shereen conducted an intensive training session centered around the HISTAR curriculum, which is designed to foster structured yet dynamic learning environments for young children. The training covered:

- Classroom Management Strategies: Educators were guided through a variety of proactive and positive behavior management techniques aimed at maintaining an engaging and respectful classroom atmosphere.

Johnson Mathew, Dean Academics, who explored differentiated learning and the importance of recognizing varied student needs.


